It is now time for the Spring spraying. It should be done before the buds grow very much. The lime and sulphur solution is the spray to use. If the prepared solution that tests 30 degrees is used, one gallon to seven or eight of water should be used, and should test about 34 when ready to apply to the tree. If the trees are dry one to eight is enough, but if the trees are damp use the solution stronger, and never apply when raining. The trees should be completely covered with the spray.—Contributed.
