## O. A. C. ANALYSIS ON SPRAY SOLUTION

B. Leis Sends The Argus Test  
Made by Authorities on Product

### ADVISES AGAINST USE OF SOLUBLE

Veteran Orchardist Gets Opinions That Is  
Authoritative

B. Leis, the Actna Orchards owner, writes the Argus: "We have just received the analysis of the so-called soluble sulphur compound, and as a warning, and also a benefit, I append a copy for the Argus. I have too much at heart the welfare of the fruit growers to let them be misled by smooth talk and glaring advertisements that it is better and cheaper than Lime & Sulphur solution. I refer growers to Prof. Melander's article in the last Weekly Oregonian, where he says at the end: 'Therefore, a drum of sulphur soda should sell at \$4.30 to compare with a barrel of Lime and Sulphur solution at \$10."

The soluble sulphur compound in fact costs about three times as much in the long run as the Lime and Sulphur solution. The analysis follows:

In comparing a product of this kind, Soluble Sulphur, with Lime-Sulphur solution, we wish to state as follows:—

One hundred pounds of Sodium Sulphur Compound, which is a Sulphide of Sodium Compound containing 60 per cent. Soluble Sulphur and 40 per cent. inert substances, which is principally soda, are advertised to be the equivalent of a 50-gallon barrel of Lime-Sulphur Solution. A 50 gallon barrel of our Lime-Sulphur Solution contains not less than 134 pounds of Soluble Sulphur, whereas it is stated that 100 pounds of Soluble Sulphur Compound contain 50 to 55 per cent. Soluble Sulphur. It would, therefore, take more than 2 100-pound kegs Soluble Sulphur Compound to equal the amount of Soluble Sulphur contained in a 50-gallon barrel of our Lime-Sulphur solution. A 50-gallon barrel of our Lime-Sulphur solution contains 538 pounds of Lime-Sulphur solution, and we guarantee not less than 25 per cent. Soluble Sulphur.

Our Lime-Sulphur solution selling at say \$7 per 50 gallons would be equivalent, or more than the equivalent, in Soluble Sulphur of 200 pounds of Soluble Sulphur Compound at \$7 per hundred.

Soluble Sulphur Compound, or Sodium Sulphur Compound, is not Lime-Sulphur solution in the powdered form. Lime-Sulphur solution is a Lime-Sulphur Compound, whereas a Sulphide of Sodium Compound is a Soda-Sulphur Compound.

When lime-sulphur solution is sprayed onto the trees the lime, on account of the action of the air, is converted to carbonate of lime and sulphate of lime. Carbonate and sulphate of lime are practically insoluble and, therefore, less liable to injure the foliage or trees than soluble products.

The Soda in a Soluble Sulphur Compound, when sprayed on to the trees, is converted by the action of the air into carbonate of soda and sulphate of soda, which products are very readily soluble, and, therefore, more liable to injure the foliage or trees than insoluble products.

Until the United States Department of Agriculture and the Experiment Stations recommend a soda-sulphur compound we will not market same.

We believe that lime-sulphur solution is much less expensive than a soda-sulphur dry compound and, therefore, most growers will use the lime-sulphur solution.
