EFFORT TO EMPLOY THE NEEDY FAMILIES

Plan Evolved to Help out Those Who are in Stress

MANY CHANCES COULD BE MADE

Eugene Brookings Visits Hillsboro With a Feasible Proposal

A society in Portland is making good in taking care of men who have families and who have been under the stress of no employment, and who do not wish to become objects of charity. Eugene Brookings, of 728 Morgan Building, Portland, was in Hillsboro, Monday, and made arrangements at the Hillsboro Mercantile for credit for a family located in the county, on a farm, east of town. Mr. Brookings says he first finds some ranch where a man and family can locate and get work enough to help along their living, and the society does the rest until the people get established. At odd times the man can work cleaning up land, put in a little garden for himself, and find occasional employment for the larger children. In time the parties can get some chickens, cow, and soon become self-supporting.

There are in Washington County many big ranches which have an extra house where a family like this could get a place to house them, and the head of the family could clear up land at odd times, thus developing the country as well as making the affair a mutual one for profit. If all who could would avail themselves of this plan to get their wild land cleared, or their places improved, there would be no unemployed in Oregon.

MICHAEL BROWN
