Receipts for the week have been cattle, 956; calves, 25; hogs, 2885; sheep, 4496. A fair run in the cattle division the first of the week. Some good pulp fed steers sold at 7 80. The market can be considered steady although the prices were a little better than paid a week ago. Good cows sell at 6 6; bulls at 6, and calves at 8 50. There was a light run in the hog division this week. Prices have jumped from 6 90 to 7 15 in the last few days. Many pigs and heavy hogs are still coming in. Tops are quoted at 7 15 at close of the week. Sheep house transactions were made quickly. The demand for mutton being so good that buyers bid 7 50 for wethers and 6 50 for ewes. Lamb market steady at 8 50. There has been quite a number of sheep coming in this week.
