OVER HALF OF TAX NOW IN TREASURY. Treasurer Sappington Gives Collections at \$245,193.72. FORTY THOUSAND YET TO RECEIVE. In Payments by Check and Money Orders -Probably More

Treasurer Sappington has registered tax collections in the sum of \$245,193.72, and this much is ready for distribution in the various funds. There is on the desk, however, several hundred more payments, and this will swell the total forty thousand, at least, and possibly fifty. Other payments ready will probably make the total reach over \$300,000.

The total tax for the year amounts to \$513,520.25, so it is a certainty that over half of the tax has been paid. The railway companies, the telephone companies, Western Union, and many other big payments are on the table in half payments, and will be cleared up before an exact accounting can be made.
