

## B. LEIS WRITES ARGUS ABOUT SPRAYING

Time Soon Here to Scotch the Codling Moth and get Good Fruit

MARKETABLE APPLES WILL BE GROWN

One Hundred Per Cent. Clean Fruit if Care is Given Orchards

B. Leis, the Beaverton fruit grower, writes the Argus as follows—"Editor Argus: Our next spraying will soon be here, and as this is the most important spraying for worms, it should not be overlooked. As I have said before, if you can't spray at this time you had better not spray at all. I will not go into details, but this admonition should be heeded by all, and will be by all good fruit raisers, and I know this class will appreciate it. There are a good many of our growers who do not understand how to raise good fruit, or if understanding, do not practice that which will bring proper results—and as a result they do not raise marketable, clean apples. I am asked many questions personally, however, and to reach all and save time, at your request I write this advice. Many are willing to spray, but do not know how, or when. I can—and so can anyone else if they will persist—raise 100 per cent. good, clean fruit, and am doing it right along. Here is my way of spraying—

For the calyx spraying I use 2 lbs. of Graselli's brand of neutral Arsenate of Lead to 50 gallons of water, adding 1 1/2 gallons of lime and sulphur spray. Don't use an acid brand as it is liable to burn the foliage. Get the Graselli neutral. There are many brands on the market that can not be used in conjunction with lime and sulphur solution, as it will not give results. First mix your arsenate of lead with water till about as thick as cream; add your lime and sulphur to the barrel; then when ready to start your pump add the arsenate of lead and keep stirred constantly. The arsenate of lead, being heavy, will settle to the bottom if not stirred. The object of this spraying is to fill the calyx cup full of poison, so when the young worms hatch, their first meal will also be their last, for as you know about 85 per cent. of the worms enter the calyx cup to the core, and in about 3 weeks they come out at the bottom and get ready for the second brood in the Fall. It will take too much time to go into detail, but about the 20th of June you should spray again, with the same formula, and then you will say, "Leis, I never raised finer apples." There are many who also tell me that they watch the paper for something on spraying and as I have written many times on the subject I again send you the admonition.

The proper time to make this spraying is after the petals or bloom have all fallen—then the calyx cup is in the right position to receive the spray."

Do not forget to ask for a Schiller when you want a good 10 cent smoke—no "cough dust" in the Schiller. 12tf

Guardian's Citation

IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR WASHINGTON COUNTY.

In the Matter of the Guardianship of Alex Beimbroh, an insane person.

It appearing to the undersigned County Judge of Washington County, Oregon, from the petition of Alex Beimbroh, Guardian of the estate of Alex Beimbroh, filed herein, that it is necessary, or would be beneficial to Alex Beimbroh, that the interest or equity of said Alex Beimbroh in the following described real property, to-wit:

Situate in the County of Washington and State of Oregon, to-wit: The right to construct and maintain and operate a water ditch and flume, each 8 feet wide, as hereinafter described, along the following center line, to-wit: Beginning at a point 13.25 chains south and 7.99 chains east of the quarter section corner on the north line of Section 7, T. 1 N., R. 4 W., Will. Mer., said beginning point being the center of the head of the said ditch, as now constructed, running thence along the center of said ditch by the following courses, to-wit: S. 74° degrees, E. 2.96 chains; thence S. 85° degrees, E. 1.50 chains; thence N. 55 degrees, E. 0.79 chains; thence N. 52° degrees, E. 1.24 chains; thence N. 82° degrees, E. 1.29 chains; thence N. 73° degrees, E. 1.49 chains; thence N. 55 minutes, E. 0.33 chains; thence S. 54° degrees, E. 0.99 chains to present head of flume; thence along center line of flume S. 25° degrees, E. 9.50 chains; thence S. 41° chains; thence S. 45 degrees, E. 8.62 chains to a point on the east line of my land distant N. 7° degrees, E. 8.43 chains from a stone set in a permanent angle on north line of a tract of two acres conveyed to J. F. Allen by deed recorded on page 27 of Book 22, Records of Deeds of Washington County, Oregon.

Also to construct, maintain and use a dam at the head of the above described head of ditch across the stream commonly known as Her Creek, also to construct, maintain and use a dam at the head of the above described dam on same creek, but not to flood any land higher than the present level of water in said creek, at my west line; also the right to divert all or any portion of the water of said Her Creek through the above described ditch, and flume, also the right to ingress to and egress from said ditch or flume or dam at any time over any premises for the purpose of repairing or building the same, together with the right to use such earth, gravel, or stone from the land adjoining the same, not exceeding 25 feet on either side of said creek, as may be necessary for such purpose, doing as little damage as is possible. I reserve, however, the right to construct bridges across said ditch and passageways under said flume, provided they are so constructed so as not to damage said ditch or flume.

An tract of land in the following: A small tract or parcel of land in Sections seven (7) and eight (8), T. 1 N., R. 4 W., beginning at a stone which bears north 68 degrees 30 minutes East of the N. W. Cor. of the Gales Creek Union Church lot, while in 16 inches in diameter bearing N. 1 degree 30 minutes E. 23 links direct of the beginning point; thence S. 90 degrees 20 minutes W. 1/2 mile; thence S. 24° 1/2 chains to the N. line of James Lovings' lot to a stone at the quarter Sec. corner between Sec. 7 and 8, bearing south 21 degrees 30 minutes west about 1.60 chains; thence S. 88 degrees 42 minutes W. 1/2 mile; north line 2.51 cha. to Lovings' N. W. corner, set an iron post, bearing N. 10 degrees 15 minutes E. 1.40 cha. to Lovings' S. corner, approximated N. line of John Hardin's D. L. Claim, set a stone, thence W. on approximated S. line of Hardin's D. L. C. 2.06 cha. set an iron post; thence N. 4 east 3.75 cha. to center of Gales Creek, set a stone for witness corner 35 links east of corner which is in center of creek from which a white fir 29 inches in diameter bears N. 66 degrees 30 minutes E. 36 links from said witness corner; thence E. 2.86 cha. set a stone; thence N. 72 degrees 12 minutes E. 1.95 cha. set iron post; thence S. 55 degrees 22 minutes to the place of beginning, containing two (2) acres, in Willamette Meridian.

Also the following pieces of real property situate in said County of Washington and State of Oregon, and described as follows: An undivided half interest in the north half of the north-west quarter and the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of Section Five West, of Willamette Meridian, containing 129 acres of land, the title of land seventy-nine (79) rods long and thirty (30) feet, more or less, wide for a roadway, beginning at the Tillamook County Road at the northwest corner of William A. Briscoe's land and running south past the section corner of Sections six and seven—then sold in order to pay the indebtedness against said estate of Alex Beimbroh and the expenses of said guardianship, and in order to obtain funds to maintain said Alex Beimbroh in said Insane Asylum; and

It further appearing that Mary Heisler and Nicholas Neppach Co. are interested in said real property, and that Joe Gassner is the next of kin of said Alex Beimbroh;

It is therefore ordered, considered and adjudged that the said Joe Gassner, next of kin of said Alex Beimbroh, Mary Heisler, Nicholas Neppach Co., and all persons interested in the guardianship estate of said Alex Beimbroh, appear in this court on Monday, the 10th day of May, 1915, at ten o'clock A. M. of said day, and then and there show cause, if any they have, why a license should not be granted, authorizing the said Joe Gassner, as guardian of the property and estate of Alex Beimbroh, to make sale of the interest of said Alex Beimbroh in all of the property hereinbefore described.

And it is further ordered, that service of this order be made upon all persons interested and the next of kin of said Alex Beimbroh, by publication thereof in the Hillsboro Argus, a weekly newspaper circulated in Washington County, Oregon, for a period of four successive weeks prior to the 30th day of April, 1915.
