Notice is hereby given that the City Engineer of Hillsboro, Oregon, has filed in his office an estimate of the whole expense and cost of improving First street, in the City of Hillsboro, Oregon, from the north side of Base Line street to the south side of Ordinance No. 129 of said city, entitled "An Ordinance for making street improvements on First street, in the City of Hillsboro, Oregon, from the north side of Jackson street to the south side of Jefferson street, as set forth in Ordinance No. 129 of said city, entitled 'An Ordinance for making street improvements on Second street, in the City of Hillsboro, Oregon, from the north side of Jackson street to the north line of Jefferson street, prescribing the character of material to be used, and providing that the costs and expenses of said improvement be assessed against the property benefited thereby,' passed by the City Council and approved by the Mayor of said city on April 6, 1915, which estimate amounts to the sum of \$4132.75.
