# TWO YEGGMAN HELD

Will be Brought to This County to Answer Charge of Rubbery

By the end of the week Sheriff Reeves will have in the Hillsboro jail two yeggmen, and they will be held for investigation, charged with the robbery of the safe at the Kinton & Schulmerich Store, at Banks, on the evening of April 13.
