**TWO YEGGMAN HELD OVER IN TILLAMOOK**  
 Will be Brought to This County to Answer Charge of Robbery  
 THOUGHT THEY ROBBED STORE SAFE  
 One is John Love, an Ex-Convict, With Unenvy Record of Years

By the end of the week Sheriff Reeves will have in the Hillsboro jail two yeggmen, and they will be held for investigation, charged with the robbery of the safe at the Kinton & Schulmerich Store, at Banks, on the evening of April 13. At the time of the burglary Sheriff Reeves discovered at Banks that two roughnecks had been seen about the town the evening before the safe was blown. The officer traced them through Buxton, Timber, and then lost track of them at West Timber. He then notified the Tillamook officials to look out for them. A few days later the two fellows showed up at Enright, where they entered a section house and stole some provisions. The section foreman saw them emerging from the place and followed them with a rifle. He found the yeggmen seated by the side of the track, and as he approached them one of the roughs reached for a revolver lying by his side. The section foreman, however, was too quick, and grasped the gun, and then held them up with the rifle. He turned them over to the Sheriff of Tillamook County, and the officials there concluded to let them go, as the charge of stealing something to eat appeared to be a small matter. McShane, of the S. P. detective force, at the time was enroute to Tillamook, and Sheriff Reeves told him to go through the jail there, and also to look out for the two travelers. McShane found one of them, John Love, to be an ex-convict, and he asked the sheriff at Tillamook to hold them until he heard from Reeves. Reeves was told and he swore to a complaint, and they are to be brought over here for trial.

Sheriff Reeves' hunch that they were enroute over the mountain proved to have been accurate, and there is little doubt that they are the ones who robbed the store safe.

In any event, they will be tried, and if identification appears good, they will have hard shift.
