HENRY C. TOELLE

Henry C. Toelle, of Shady Brook, died in Hillsboro, May 5, 1915. He had been suffering from an attack of appendicitis, and one day last week a rupture occurred, necessitating an operation. He was brought to Hillsboro and operated on by Dr. Hyde. The physician told Mrs. Toelle that he had but a chance in a thousand to live, as septic matter had spread.

He was born April 23, 1871, in Herman, Mo., and came to Oregon with his parents in 1881. He was married to Miss Amelia Hoffman, at Tigardville, Sept. 25, 1905. They lived two years in South Tualatin and then moved to Shady Brook, where he purchased a farm. He leaves to mourn his loss his parents, Mr. and Mrs. H. W. Toelle, Phillips, and the following brothers and sisters:

The funeral takes place tomorrow at Phillips, at the Toelle home, 11 a. m., and interment will be in the Bethany Pres. Cemetery.

Mr. Toelle was a highly respected citizen, and was esteemed by all who knew him.
