Guardian's Citation IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR WASHINGTON COUNTY.

In the Matter of the Guardianship of Alex Beismrohr, an insane person. It appearing to the undersigned County Judge of Washington County, Oregon, from the petition of Geo. B. Bagley, Guardian of the estate of Alex Beismrohr, filed herein, that it is necessary, or would be beneficial to Alex Beismrohr, that the interest of said estate be administered in the following described real property, to-wit:

Situate in the County of Washington and State of Oregon, to-wit: The right to construct and maintain and operate water ditch and flume (each 6 feet wide) as hereinafter described, along the following center line, to-wit: Beginning at a point 18.35 chains south and 7.09 chains east of the quarter section corner on the north line of Section 7, T. 1 N., R. 4 W., Wil. Mer., said beginning point being the center of the head of the said ditch, as now constructed, running thence along the center of said ditch by the following courses and distances: S. 75 1/2 degrees, E. 2.05 chains; thence S. 55 1/2 degrees, E. 1.59 chains; thence N. 85 degrees, E. 1.24 chains; thence S. 75 degrees, E. 1.24 chains; thence S. 85 1/2 degrees, E. 1.29 chains; thence S. 85 1/2 degrees, E. 1.49 chains; thence S. 85 1/2 degrees, E. 9.26 chains; thence S. 63 1/2 degrees, E. 5.99 chains; thence S. 54 1/2 degrees, E. 3.29 chains to present head of flume; thence along center line of flume S. 25 1/2 degrees, E. 2.59 chains; thence S. 45 degrees, E. 4.43 chains to a point on the east line of my land distant N. 7 1/2 degrees, E. 9.63 chains from a stone set in remonstrant angle on north line of a tract of two acres conveyed to J. F. Allen by deed recorded on page 27 of Book 32, Records of Deeds of Washington County, Oregon.

Also to construct, maintain and use a dam at the head of the above described head of ditch across the stream, commonly known as Her Creek, also to construct, maintain and use a dam, 20 feet high above the above said dam on same creek, but not to flood any land higher than the present level of water in said creek, at my west line; also the right to divert to any portion of the water of said Her Creek through the above described ditch and flume; also the right of ingress to and egress from said ditch or flume or dam at any time over any premises for the purpose of repairing or building the same, together with the right to use such earth, gravel, or stone from the land adjoining the same not exceeding 25 feet on either side of said creek, as may be necessary for such purposes, doing as little damage as is possible. I reserve, however, the right to construct bridges across said ditch and dam, and highway, said flume, provided they are so constructed so as not to damage said ditch or flume.

An equity in the following: A small tract or parcel of land in Section seven (7) and eight (8), T. 1 N., R. 4 W., beginning at a stone which bears north 60 degrees 20 minutes East of the N. W. Cor. of the Gates Creek Union Church Lot, a white flag 40 inches diameter bearing S. 1 degree 30 minutes E. 23 links direct of the beginning point; thence S. 00 degrees 30 minutes W. Var. 21 degrees E. along W. line of said church lot, 2.64 chains; thence S. 89 degrees 55 minutes E. along N. line of James Loving's lot to a stone at the quarter section corner between Sec 7 and 8, bearing south 21 degrees 20 minutes west about 1.60 chains; thence S. 35 degrees 45 minutes W. on Loving's line 3.41 chs. to Loving's N. W. corner; set an iron post; thence S. on Loving's W. line 1.40 chs. to Loving's S. corner, approximated N. line of John Hardin's D. L. Claim; set a stone, bearing W. on approximated N. line of Hardin's D. L. C. 3.06 chs. set an iron post; thence N. 4 east 3.75 chs. to center of Gates Creek, set a stone for witness corner; 29 links east of corner which is in center of creek from which a white flag 30 inches in diameter bears N. 66 degrees 30 minutes E. 36 links from said witness corner; thence E. 1.30 chs. set a stone; thence N. 7 degrees 15 minutes E. 1.95 chs. set iron post; thence S. 56 degrees E. 2.52 chs. to the place of beginning, containing two (2) acres, in Willamette Meridian.

Also the following pieces of real property situate in said County of Washington and State of Oregon, and described as follows: An undivided half interest in the north half of the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of Section Twelve, Township One North, Range Five West, of Willamette Meridian, containing 12 1/2 acres of land. One strip of land seventy-nine (79) rods long and thirty (30) feet, more or less, wide for a roadway, beginning at the Tillamook County Road at the northwest corner of James B. Britton's land, and running south past the section corner of Sections six and seven - be sold in order to pay the indebtedness against said estate of Alex Beismrohr, and the expenses said guardian may be compelled to incur in order to maintain said Alex Beismrohr in said Insane Asylum; and

It is further appearing that Mary Heister and Nicholas Neppach Co. are interested in said real property, and that Joe Gassner is the next of kin of said Alex Beismrohr;

It is therefore ordered, considered and adjudged, that the said Joe Gassner, next of kin of said Alex Beismrohr, Mary Heister, Nicholas Neppach Co., and all persons interested in the guardianship estate of said Alex Beismrohr, appear in this court on Monday, the 10th day of May, 1915, at ten o'clock A. M. of said day, and then and there show cause, if any they have, why a license should not be granted, authorizing the guardian, as guardian of the property and estate of Alex Beismrohr, to make sale of the interest of said Alex Beismrohr in all of the property hereinbefore described.

And it is further ordered, that service of this order be made upon all persons interested and the next of kin of said Alex Beismrohr, by publication thereof in the Washington County, Oregon newspaper circulated in Washington County, Oregon, for a period of four successive weeks prior to the 30th day of April, 1915.
