The experience of Assessor Max Crandall on valuations and his state reputation as an expert accountant has brought to him a mission of importance in the matter of his selection as one of the commission to start the new county of Jefferson on its new book account. There will be many tangles in straightening out the averages between Crook County and the new commonwealth, but Mr. Crandall will be equal to the task.

Those newspapers so hysterically calling for war with Germany are, as a rule, those which have wanted your Uncle Samuel to send an army into Mexico, and their vapors should be taken for what they are worth. If the weight of authorities find that the Lusitania was carrying contraband of war, then Germany's sinking of the vessel was within her rights, and the citizen of any country who was aboard was in the position of a person on British soil during a war period. If, on the other hand, it can be proven that no explosives, no ammunition, nor contraband of any kind, was in the cargo, then Germany will submit to indemnity. This is a time when Americans can afford to await the evidence. Dispatches at first sent emphatically stated that over \$200,000 worth of contraband was in the cargo. When this is proven, or when it is not substantiated, the affair will come to a showdown.
