In the New Jefferson County and Old Crook County Divide Debt

ASSESSOR MAX CRANDALL'S BIG TASK

Will Meet With Commission in Few Days as County Can Organize

Max Crandall, Washington County Assessor, has been notified that he is one of the commission of three, appointed by the county court of Crook county and the new county court of Jefferson County, and the duties of the commission will be to determine the values of the district which is to be divided, and apportion the debts, as well as the assets. The new county, which was made by the vote of the people at the last general election, will organize some time in June, and the commission will endeavor to have everything ready so that books can be opened without delay.

Mr. Crandall has a wide acquaintance through the Eastern Oregon section, as he has expected many sets of county books. He was not an applicant for the place and it came to him without solicitation. Being an assessor as well as an accountant, peculiarly gifts him for the position, and he will leave shortly to take up the work. Mr. Crandall does not know the names of the two other commissioners, but thinks they, too, will be assessors.
