Receipts for the week have been cattle, 975; calves, 10; hogs, 2138; sheep, 2442.

With a medium supply on sale the market opened on a good active basis and with prices 10 to 15 cents higher than a week ago. Choice steers are selling around 7 50 to 7 90, cows 6 25 to 6 60.

Swine market opened up with an advance of 10 to 15 cents over the closing of last week's quotations. Several loads at 8 05 to 8 10 represented the top of the market, while the bulk went from 7 80 to 8. Market steady at close of week.

The sheep supply was small and the market quiet. A couple loads of Spring lambs went at 8 25 being the top price paid for that class of stuff. Shorn ewes are quoted at 5 50 to 5 75 and yearlings at 7.
