SHERIFF REEVES TAKES TAX ROLL

Treasurer Sappington Collects no More After Last Friday

STILL KEEPS ROLLS IN OFFICE

Writes Receipts and Payor Takes Same to Sheriff For Receipt

Beginning with last Saturday Sheriff Reeves again became the official tax collector for Washington County. Treasurer E. B. Sappington still has the original rolls, which he is balancing to turn over about June 1, but he handles no money. His office force, however, is writing the receipts for payments, and the payor then takes the blank to the sheriff's office, where it is receipted.

It has been no small tax to get the balances made, with all the requisitions properly credited, and it has taken time.

The new sheriff's office is now so arranged that there will be plenty of room for tax collection, the quarters prepared being the best the county has ever enjoyed.
