SPPAYING

Spray for the Codling Moth as soon as the weather settles, between the 15th and 20th of June. The fruit should be thoroughly sprayed with arsenate of lead (2) lbs. to 50 gals of water. Keep the solution well stirred while using, and apply only when the trees are dry. This is the most important time to spray for worms.
