PERRY E. HUGHES

The late Perry E. Hughes, announcement of whose death was in last week's issue, died Aug. 25, 1915, after a brief illness. He was aged 41 years, 1 month and 22 days, and was born in Jennings County, Indiana, July 3, 1874. For 24 years he has been a member of the Christian Church. He married Miss Rosa Judd in 1895. MUNICIPAL WOOD BURNS

Portland's municipal wood pile, containing somewhere near three thousand cords, cut near Beaverton, burned Friday night—and the problem of disposing of it is now dissolved like snow upon the desert's dusty face. Whether it caught fire accidentally or was incendiary is not known. The loss reaches about \$2.00 per cord—but, of course, the City of Portland will save the cost of hauling. Teams had already started hauling into Portland, and the haulers found themselves out of a job Saturday morning.

The city paid \$1 for stumpage, last Winter, and established a camp for the unemployed. The cost of cutting was another dollar, so the loss is \$6,000, less that which had been hauled, which was not very many cords. The wood was cut on the north slope of Cooper Mountain, south of Huber. The blaze caught somewhere about midnight, and it is thought it caught from a running fire in the brush.
