MUNICIPAL WOOD BURNS

Portland's municipal wood pile, containing somewhere near three thousand cords, cut near Beaverton, burned Friday night-and the problem of disposing of it is now dissolved like snow "upon the desert's dusty face. Whether it caught fire accidentally or was incendiary is not known. The loss reaches about \$2.00 per cord-but, of course, the City of Portland will save the cost of hauling. The cost of cutting was another dollar, so the loss is \$6,000, less that which had been hauled, which was not very many cord. The wood was cut on the north slope of Cooper Mountain, south of Huber. The blaze caught some-where about midnight, and it is thought it caught from a running fire in the brush.
