SUNDAY CLOSING

The die is cast—and the confectioneries of Washington County will no longer remain open on Sundays. Sheriff Reeves notified the Hillsboro proprietors that they must keep their doors closed on that day, in conformity to the statute passed so many years ago. Several convictions were had in Portland, and although no great pressure was brought here because of the obsolescence of the law, several wrote letters

to the fact that the law said these places were under the ban—and "pop" went the edict.

Some of the confectioners find Sunday their best day, while others say they would just as soon rest on that day as to keep open. So far as known, all will obey the injunction of the sheriff. The theatres will remain open throughout the county, and the bakers and meat market men can also keep open for business. Only such grocers as have meat markets installed can transact business on that date.

In all probability the next legislature will pass legislation to repeal the law, which is an old one, and which is arbitrary in a respect to a business that could possibly insult no one's intelligence.

Next year the ball parks will no doubt get their medicine all over the state unless there is legislation that repeals the statute as it now stands.

Vendors of daily papers have already cut down their Sunday supply, one having cut down the list 20, while another, it is understood, will chisel his order down 25.

These agents say that the fact that the confectioners kept open meant a sale of from 20 to 25 more papers each Sunday, as many came in from the country and bought a paper when they could find one on sale at these places.

The Ladies of the Baptist Church will hold a sale of aprons, quilts and comforters, in the Hillsboro Annex Block, Second Street, Saturday, October 30. A fine chicken dinner will be served at noon. Sale will begin in the forenoon and continue all day.
