**BIG LITIGATION OVER REANWORTH GARDENS**  
Plaintiffs, Molesworth and Reagan. See For \$10,000, Over Contract PROPERTY NEAR RALEIGH STATION

Four days were consumed in circuit court, before Judge Geo. R. Bagley, last week, where in T. S. Molesworth and C. G. Reagan were plaintiffs, asking for \$10,000 damages for breach of contract, the defendant being J. J. Conaway, who owned a tract of land near Raleigh station, on the S. P., and Whitford station, on the Oregon Electric. Molesworth and Reagan entered into a contract with Conaway to plat the land and put it on the market. Conaway was to get \$11,000 net for the property, and the promoters were to have the surplus. The plaintiffs alleged that after they had sales well under way Conaway refused to go ahead and make deeds when they found purchasers, and suit was brought, not to enforce the contract, but to make Conaway pay them what it would have been worth to them had the contract been enforced.

The land was platted as Reanworth Gardens, and embraced one of the finest tracts in that section. F. H. Whitfield and J. B. O'ner were attorneys for Molesworth and Reagan, and Sears & Benedict appeared for the defendant. Many witnesses were placed on the stand and there was an attempt to impeach almost every witness who appeared in the case. Really, it looked as though that attempt to impeach would have been made had the Divine one Himself been in receipt of a subpoena. The jury found a verdict for Molesworth in the sum of \$1,500, after being out until 1:30 Saturday morning, deliberating twelve hours. That it was a compromise verdict goes without saying.

The jury in the case: Arthur H. Thomas, Jacob Correll, Orton Giebler, Geo W. Miller, Daniel Rainwater, G. A. Plieth, Antone Hermens, Geo Galbreath, Thos Connell, Jas R. Hayden, John T. Martin and J. B. Trullinger. Other court news: Geo Galbreath, juror in Molesworth vs Conaway, was excused on account of illness and both sides agreed to continue with 11 jurors. Ames vs Ames, default, and divorce granted Mrs. Ames. Maria Campbell was granted a divorce from J. E. Campbell. Set for trial—State vs Edwards, Dec 2 & 3; State vs Hill, Dec 24; State vs Bondshu, Dec 20 and 21.
