**F. G. MILLER LOOKS DEATH IN THE FACE**

Horse Struck and Killed at Meier Crossing on Southern Pacific

**TWO MEN THROWN FROM RIG**

Strange to Relate Neither Was Injured in the Collision

Frank G. Miller, of Scholls, had a Happy New Year's Day, after all that a horse he was driving was struck and killed by the Southern Pacific Electric train, Friday morning, at the Meier Crossing, near Newton. Miller was driving toward Hillsboro, from his Scholls home, and talking to a man, in his covered rig, when, to his surprise, just as his off horse struck the rails of the S. P. the red car's pilot struck the animal, turning it clear around, the horse falling as if shot. Miller and his companion were thrown out of the rig, but neither was injured.

Miller states that when he arrived at Newton a man asked for a ride. He let him get in the vehicle, and as they approached the crossing, had no thought of the train. Miller says: "I was talking to the stranger and did not hear the train, at all. I guess it was my fault, too, for I am hard of hearing in my right ear, and did not hear the approaching train. The curtains of the hack came forward to the brake, and I did not look to see if the track were clear, and neither did I hear the gong, which, the neighbors there say, was ringing violently. The car struck the horse, reversing it completely. The animal died inside of five minutes. We were both thrown out, and I'm mighty thankful to be alive. My harness was shattered, and the vehicle was injured slightly. I am going home on a saddle horse. The horse I lost was a good one and cost me over \$100."

Conductor Frederickson was in charge of the train, and Motor-man Pettygrove was at the throttle.


