A private letter from a former Hillsboro resident now at San Diego states that the San Diego Fair will continue open through 1916, and to the exhibits of last year have been added the displays of Canada, France, Italy, Germany, Austria, Russia, Netherlands, Brazil, and the U. S. government exhibit. Now that the auto road is open between Los Angeles and San Diego the travel to the uttermost Southern city on the coast will be extensive during the coming Summer.

Art Miltenberger, of Route 1, made his return to Hillsboro, Saturday, by midnight. He encountered fallen trees and had to make his way through fields to get along the route. On returning he drove into a drift, on the East Plains, and tipped his rig over. Leaving it as a marker for the next traveler he came on into town. His watch had stopped and the clock on the court house was not running, so he guessed the time at midnight. Sunday morning he went out and picked up his rig and was on duty Monday morning, and started out. He was unable to make the trip, however, and returned, as did John Ryan, carrier on Route 3. The roads were drifted so deep that milk haulers abandoned their wagons, and Dr. W. D. Wood, who started for North Plains, on a medical trip, was obliged to cancel the call, after getting out as far as the Luck place.
