The new law is creating trouble for those voters who have been exercising the right of suffrage on the strength of oath that their fathers were naturalized. The present law requires that they shall submit proof of this, and this is causing a great deal of annoyance to scores of electors in Washington County. Many who know their fathers were granted second papers are not aware of the court which issued the papers, and their fathers have passed away. Just how the tangle will be avoided is not apparent. Clerk Luce states that several have already been turned away, and he is powerless to accept the registry, under the statute.
