NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, February 15, 1916, the tax rolls for the year 1915 will be opened for the collection of taxes. The first half of all taxes shall be paid on or before April 5th following, and the second half on or before October 5th following. Interest shall be charged and collected at the rate of 1 per cent per month or a fraction of a month until paid. "Interest" as said rate applies to the first half if not paid by April 5th, and to the second half if not paid by Oct. 5." All taxes remaining unpaid on Oct. 5, shall become delinquent, and on Nov. 5th a penalty of 5 per cent. will be charged and collected thereon in addition to the interest provided herein. Any day after the expiration of six months after the taxes charged against real property are delinquent, the Sheriff shall have the right, and it shall be his duty upon demand to make out and issue certificates of delinquency against such property. Certificates of delinquency shall bear interest at the rate of 15 per cent.
