RURAL CARRIER EXAMINATION

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced an examination for the County of Washington, Oregon, to be held at Forest Grove and Hillsboro, on May 27, 1916, to fill the position of rural carrier at Gaston and vacancies that may later occur on rural routes from other post offices in the above-mentioned county. The examination will be open only to male citizens who are actually domiciled in the territory of a post office in the county and who meet the other requirements set forth in Form No. 1977. SUMMONS

IN THE CIRCUIT COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON, FOR WASHINGTON COUNTY.

Ben Anderson, Plaintiff, vs. Laura A. Caples and R. A. Caples, by husband, W. M. Nelson, J. Chris O'Day and A. Welch, Defendants.

To R. A. Caples and W. M. Nelson, of the above named defendants: In the name of the State of Oregon, you are hereby commanded and required to appear and answer the amended complaint of the plaintiff filed against you in the above entitled Court and cause on or before the 10th day of June, 1916, said date being after the expiration of six weeks from the date of the publication of this summons, and if you fail so to appear and answer said amended complaint for want thereof the plaintiff will apply to the Court for the relief prayed for and demanded in his amended complaint, to-wit: For a judgment against the defendants, Laura A. Caples and R. A. Caples, in the sum of \$2500.00 in United States Gold Coin with interest thereon from the 27th day of February, 1915, at the rate of 8 per cent per annum, and the further sum of \$300.00 attorney's fees and the costs and disbursements of said suit; and for a decree declaring the said mortgage in the sum of \$2500.00, executed on the 27th day of August, 1914, by the defendants Laura A. Caples and R. A. Caples in favor of the plaintiff, and which said mortgage was on said date filed for record in the office of the Recorder of Conveyances of Washington County, Oregon, at page 616 of Book 67, Mortgage Records of said county and state, to be a first lien upon the following described parcel of real property, situate in Washington County, Oregon, to-wit:
