RURAL CARRIER EXAMINATION

Nelson, of the above named defendants: In the name of the State of Oregon, you are hereby summoned and required to appear and answer the amended complaint of the plaintiff, Benjamin Anderson, in the above entitled Court and cause on or before the 10th day of June, 1916, said date being after the expiration of six weeks from the date of the publication of this summons, and if you fail so to appear and answer said amended complaint, I will thereupon apply to the Court for the writ of fieri facias and execution in his favor, to wit: To wit: A judgment against the defendants, Laura A. Caples and R. A.
