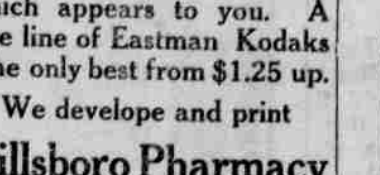

The present district attorney is flooding the county with letters telling of his record and asserting that I have had assistance in some of the important cases I have tried. He states that every damage and equity case tried has been won for the county; that no money has been paid for outside assistance and that the costs and fees collected approximately pay the entire expense of the criminal courts. Not that a single figure is published. Voters are entitled to figures that they may judge for themselves. In seven and one half years he has tried three damage and four equity cases; has had an assistant all the time, except the last four cases, paid by the taxpayers; has tried five cases in the Supreme court, won three and lost two.

The year 1915 was an average year and the fines and costs collected amounted to \$2,956.35 and the entire expense of operating the criminal
