## PIONEER SAM R. STOTT PASSES IN PORTLAND

Was Son of Beaverton Pioneer, Well Known Here and at Gaston WAS ATTORNEY OF THE OLD SCHOOL Died at Home of Brother-in-Law, T. W. Thompson, Suddenly, Heart Trouble

Samuel R. Stott, Oregon pioneer, born near Beaverton, in April, 1855, died at the home of his brother-in-law, Timothy W. Thompson, East Taylor Street, Portland, June 21, 1916. He was an attorney by profession. His parents settled near Beaverton in the early fifties and young Stott spent his early life at Beaverton and Gaston, later studying law. He was admitted to practice and opened an office in Portland. The greater part of his days, however, were spent in Washington County.  
He was educated at Pacific University, and practiced law a few years at Sumpter, returning to the Willamette Valley in 1908.  
Sam Stott had a wide acquaintance in the state, and his brother, Judge Raleigh Stott, was one of Oregon's noted jurists.  
He is survived by his sister, Mrs. Thompson, and two nephews, F. S. Meyers, of Portland's postmastership, and Plowden Stott.  
Stott was well known in Hillsboro, particularly among the pioneerage.  
The funeral took place Friday, and the remains were taken to Gaston for interment.
