And also excepting therefrom certain portions thereof which have been released from the lien of said mortgage, as described in said complaint, and that the right, title, interest, liens or claims of the defendants, and each of them, are subsequent in point of time and merit to plaintiffs' said mortgage, and that plaintiffs' said mortgage and that plaintiffs' said mortgage and each of them be foreclosed, and the real property be sold as upon execution, and that the defendants, and each of them, be forever barred and foreclosed of all right, title or interest which they or any of them had on or the 28th day of February, 1911, the date of plaintiffs' said mortgage, or have since had in or to said real property, or any part thereof, and that plaintiffs be given such other and further relief as to court may seem meet and equitable.

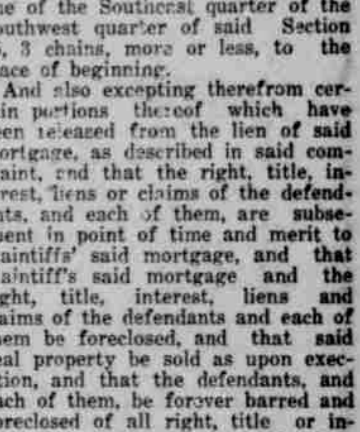
