A STATEMENT.

During my service as County Judge I have devoted my entire time, given the closest personal attention to all matters brought before me, and endeavored to perform my duties fairly and faithfully for the best interests of all the people of this County to make every tax dollar go the farthest possible. The People are demanding good roads. They are made under the supervision of the Road Supervisors and under the present system of road building efficient supervisors must be secured or all the money spent is as good as thrown away. The County Board as a whole is responsible for the appointment of Road Supervisors. I had one vote out of three in their appointment as the law provides. If some were disappointed that is only what has happened during the 28 years I have lived in this County. In the case which I presume is referred to in the Recall Petition a demand was made for the removal of a Supervisor already appointed and the appointment of a man who had failed of re-appointment. With the threat of a recall unless the demand was granted the Court refused to dismiss without just cause being assigned.

JUDGE REASONER

The Argus believes that Judge Reasoner should be sustained and allowed to remain in the position to which he was elected. No previous county judge has given more hard work to the office, and the sole complaint is the matter of the appointment of a supervisor, here and there. This is a small matter, and should not enter into the campaign. If recall follows the non-appointment of a road supervisor, then no county judge is safe in his position. Judge Reasoner's opponents have filed no other cause of complaint. They do not assert that there is any maladministration. In the name of justice and equity, then, let the voters of Washington County vote to keep in office the county judge, who has given more hard to his office, and more real time effort, than any judge in the history of the county.

Never in National history has a president asked for and received so much legislation affecting the best interests of the man in the common walks of life—the farmer and the laborer. Legislation asked for years by the Grange and producing elements has been placed on the archives of law, and as was predicted four years ago, Woodrow Wilson's administration will be known as the Victorian age of American politics.

Election day is next Tuesday and the great American voters will choose their president. At present it looks as though America will stand for peace and Woodrow Wilson, without doubt. The pendulum has been swinging Wilsonward for two or three weeks, and New York, Indiana and Illinois, with several big Western and middle-west states, all look safe for Wilson.
