The Oregon Electric has been doing an immense freight on the Forest Grove branch the past few weeks. On Saturday eight empties were sidetracked here, with more than that many loads taken out. It now keeps one crew busy on the line, bringing in empties and taking out the freight. There are both Northern cars, and shippers with spurs running in from the S. P. are taking advantage of the car situation on the O. E., and are getting their lumber, grain and potatoes to market via that route. On the S. P. line, at Timber alone, four carloads of potatoes were piled after they had been brought to the station—there being no cars for shipment. The Southern Pacific is losing thousands of dollars every day in this territory by reason of no available freight cars.

Six precincts in the county returned a majority for President Wilson, one being rather strong German-Buxton. Those carrying for Wilson, and their majorities, are Aloha, 18; West Beaverton, 4; Buxton, 24; Mountain, 17; Purdin, 2; Verboort, 15. Buxton has the honor of being the banner Wilson precinct.
