Apostasy in religion going about the country with bitter denunciations of the religious ties once embraced and now eschewed is never authoritative to the thinking mind. Somehow there is always something venal about such conduct, and it is never conducive of good and besides, it only serves to unnecessarily disturb local community fellowship.
Vicious charges by the cuckoo press that the 400,000 plurality for President Wilson consist of long-haired men and short-haired women only exemplify the mental warp of those who stood for Mr. Hughes in newspaper support. Gratuitous insult is easy behind the columns of vindictive newspapers—and while these same sheets boast of bravery it is dollars against pennies that these same writers are chary about making such statements personally, to the rank and file of men, to say nothing of the women, who voted for the President.
Candidate Hughes has at last congratulated Mr. Wilson on his election. The telegram was sent late last night. California was conceded, and Chairman Wilcox says there will be no further action taken by the National committee.
M. T. Madsen, of Sherwood, on the old Williams farm, presents a bill to the county for 36 head of cattle, killed because of tuberculous infection. The claim is for \$900—this is the largest claim of its kind presented, and there is no fund to meet it.
County Court held a short session yesterday, and awarded the painting of the county machinery house on Baseline to C. A. Broderson, of Forest Grove, for \$120. The other bidders were W. H. Taylor, \$198, and J. H. Ray, \$183. The court ordered \$50 paid to N. Tannier, for removing goat house on proposed Beaverton Bertha road, and ordered warrant drawn to Ole Olson for \$500, if accepted, for damages in running through place.
Bertha Howatt sues Edward A. Howatt, an expert sawfiler at West Timber, asking the court for a decree of divorce. There is a son, aged 12 years, and she asks the custody of the lad, and says he is in need of an operation to one of his eyes. She wants suit money, \$50 per month alimony for the keep of herself and boy until he is 21 years old, and \$2,000 permanent alimony. She says the husband has \$4,000 due him from his father in California, and she wants him enjoined from spending it or putting it out of the reach of the court.
