WHAT CHANCES?

The Military Hospital Commission at Quebec has kept an account of how Canadian troops fared in the war, and has compiled some interesting statistics, based upon its investigations and observations. Addressing Canadian mothers

and fathers, the commission says: If your boy goes to the front; He has 29 chances of coming home to one of being killed.

He has 98 chances of recovering from a wound to two chances of dying.

He has only one chance in 500 of losing a limb.

He will live five years longer because of physical training.

He is more free of disease in the army than in civil life.

He has better medical care at the front than at home.

In other wars from 10 to 15 men died from disease to every 10 from bullets. This war is less wasteful of life than any other in history.

Only 10 per cent of all Canadians disabled for further service have been physically unable to engage in their former occupations.

If your boy is one of the 10 per cent the government will re-educate him in another vocation at which he can earn a living.

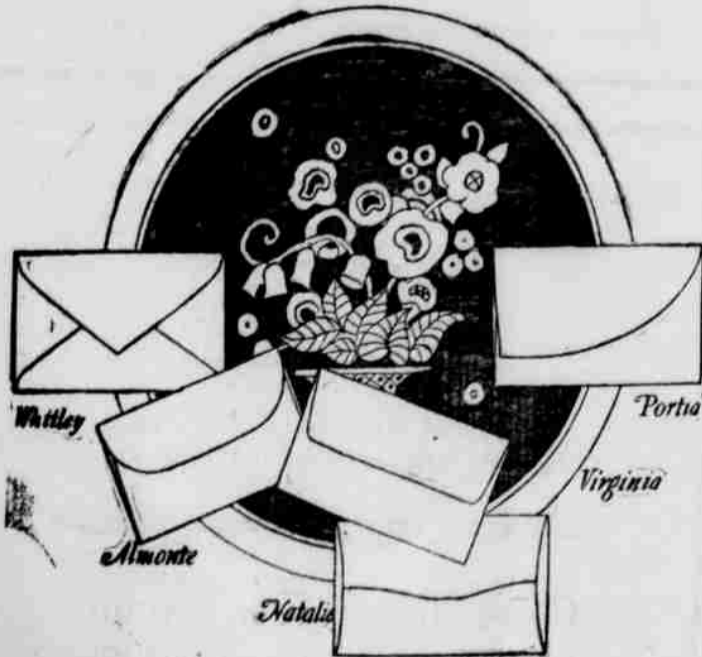
