MAN DROPS DEAD

Julius Swenson, a farmer of Manning, dropped dead Tuesday forenoon, while visiting a neighbor. Swenson went over to the farm of Mary H. Preston, to talk about a woodsaw, and they then started to look for a cow belonging to Preston. Climbing a steep hill Swenson complained of heart bothering him, and said he must sit down. He had more than seated himself on a log than he toppled over on his face. Mr. Preston picked him up and found he had no pulse. Dr. Via was sent for and he decided that death was due to valvular trouble. Coroner Geo. J. Chamber went up and investigated the case and this was his finding. Swenson was aged 39 years, and leaves a widow and several grown children. He had lived at Manning about 7 years, and had been complaining of heart trouble for some time.

DRAFT DATE NAMED

The war board has sent out the date for the draft for Lt. M. Dowell, which was made the other day. The boys will convene at Hillsboro at nine o'clock in the morning on June 1, and assemble at the court house. They will have dinner here and then leave on the Tillamook line train at four o'clock in the afternoon. They go to Portland and connect the same evening for California.

The war board at a recent meeting decided to name no other places than the county seat for the registration of those who reached the age of 21 years since a year ago last June. So the next registrants will assemble at Hillsboro on June 5 to put their names on the roll of Uncle Sam's eligible men for army service. The examinations will start soon thereafter and will get all those fit to go.
