BIG BARN LOSS

The big barn on the Austin Buxton place, near Forest Grove, was completely destroyed by fire Friday evening between five and six o'clock. Jesse Traver, lessee of the place, was milking at the time, and does not know how the fire caught. He succeeded in getting the 26 head of dairy cows and other stock out of the barn, and saved his tractor, but 100 tons of hay, all his farm machinery, and much other personal property went up in smoke. The big silo attached to the structure was also destroyed. During the fire the silo gasses caused an explosion and threw a terrific cloud of smoke into the heavens. This was seen here at Hillsboro, and the gasses formed a huge dog's head in the heavens.

There was no insurance, and the barn being worth probably \$3,000, and being comparatively new, and the 100 tons of hay worth \$3,000, the loss is low at the estimate of ten thousand dollars.

The loss is a severe one on both the lessee, Mr. Traver, and on the owner of the barn, the Buxton estate.

MRS. GEO. PERRINE

Mrs. Geo. Perrine, well known here when her husband contracted in this section in the early nineties, died a few days ago in California. The remains were brought to Yamhill County for burial. Mr. Perrine and a daughter survives. He states that death was very sudden. She complained of a violent headache one evening, and within a few minutes was completely paralyzed.

From here the Perrines moved to St. Johns, and later to California, after spending a year at McMinnville and other Yamhill points.

SON FOLLOWS FATHER

Raymond Heltzel, son of the late Horry Heltzel, died at the family home, Dec. 6, 1918, after but a few days illness, his malady being the prevalent influenza. His father had died but a few days prior passing. He was born in 1892. The funeral took place Saturday and interment was at Banks.
