THREE-IN-ONE

A three-in-one case was decided in Circuit Court last Thursday afternoon, when a jury gave Donald Gregg a verdict for his costs in the suit wherein S. & F. Ullman sued for \$102.63, alleged balance due for moneys advanced on a hop crop. There were two other suits of similar nature filed in the same court by the same company as plaintiff, with W. J. Gregg and Thos. Gregg as defendants. The Greggs alleged in their pleadings and apparently with 100 per cent effect, that they had made a settlement with the Ullmans, through their agents, wherein the Ullmans were to take a crop of 30 acres of oats, delivered at the Buchanan warehouse, in full of all demands for moneys advanced to the Greggs, father and sons, severally and in common. The evidence showed that the Ullman agents thought they had a good bargain, at that, for oats were away up in price. But the "bugs," that bane of a crop once in a while, concluded that the Gregg field was the proper sector to conduct a war and the way that field looked when they got through would put to shame a battle-field where the Huns had operated with a big majority of men and guns. So, then, when the crop turned out poorly the agents for the Hebrew hop firm brought suit—much to their sorrow. Attorney Hare handled the case for the Greggs, and the jury's first ballot, without deliberation, boded poor for the hop buyers. Gregg won on all counts and the Ullmans must pay the costs. The jury—J. M. Pritchard, Jacob Dahinden, C. Blaser, W. B. Emmons, G. W. McGraw, Alfred Freerkson, Anthony Christensen, R. M. Banks, Walter H. Cole, L. W. House, Thad C. Reynolds and M. C. Lincoln. The jury will hereafter know what ails an oat crop when it looks "tollable sickly."

The entire amount asked for in the three suits would make \$2,000 look sick.

AUTO ACCIDENT

A serious automobile accident took place on the Baseline road, at Oak Park, Thursday evening, when a machine driven by L. P. Fiske, of Cornelius, and John Wunderlich, of Banks, ran into Edwin Reese, aged 13, who was riding a bicycle. Young Reese was rendered unconscious and brought to the Dr. E. H. Smith hospital, where he was treated by Dr. Smith. Two of his ribs were broken, one of his lungs badly injured, and his pelvic region badly bruised and lacerated. He is getting along much better than was expected when first picked up.

Mr. Fiske was just learning to operate the machine, and he feels very badly over the affair. The accident was one of those unfortunate things that come in a second, and it is hard to fix any responsibility.

The Reese boy and two others, his brother, Lloyd, and Shelby Forney, were all on bicycles, and were going down to the Forney place, a few rods west when the collision took place.

Mr. Reese takes exceptions to the published report that his boy was to blame for the accident. Both the bicyclist and auto were going west on Baseline.

The boy regained consciousness Saturday morning, and it looks as though he will recover fully.
