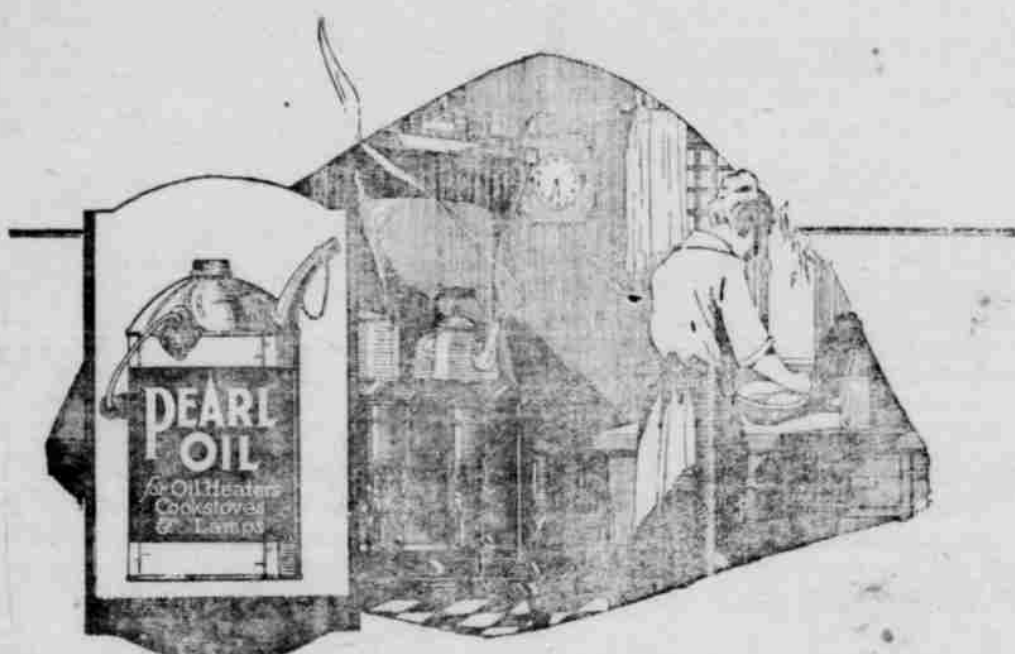

VICTORY ROSE FESTIVAL STARTS NEXT WEEK

Seven or Eight Planes to Visit the Rose City

MARTIN "BOMBER" COMING

Fleet of Warships Coming From Southern Waters

Portland, Ore., June 3—On the eve of the Victory Rose Festival, June 11, 12 and 13, every indication points to the most successful of all festivals.

A squadron of seven—possibly eight—acrobats, six JN4H, one de Havilland and one huge Martin bomber, will fly from Mather Field, Sacramento, under the command of Lieut. Colonel Watson. It is possible that General Monohor, commanding officer of the field, will take the flight in the Martin bomber which is being tuned up in anticipation of the flight. These planes will arrive in Portland late June 10th, after the trip over the Siskiyou and stops at Medford, Roseburg, Eugene, Salem and possibly other Western Oregon cities. They will remain here to take part in the huge aerial circus, and at times will carry civilian passengers on flights over the city.

Rear Admiral Fullam, aboard his flagship, the Minneapolis, will bring a fleet of warships from southern waters. Two seaplanes will be brought by the Minneapolis, the first to be seen in action in the Northwest.

Salem, Oregon City, Eugene, Madras, Roseburg, Brownsville, Hillsboro, Prineville, and La Grande, in Oregon, will all enter floats in the festival pageants, while Seattle, Tacoma, Port Angeles, Chehalis, Montesano, Kalama, Ridgefield, Camas and Centralia, in Washington, will take part. Other Oregon and Washington cities have yet to make formal entry although their presence has been assured. Vancouver, B. C., with its fleet, will make the festival an international rating.

The Victory Industrial parade will be held June 11, under the joint auspices of the festival and the 16th annual convention of the Pacific Coast Advertising Men's Association. The monster military parade will follow June 12th, in which the principal military units and organizations and their auxiliaries will play leading parts. The huge floral parade, the feature of every festival, will be a glorious climax for the festival, June 13th.

In addition to the fleets of warships and acrobats, the parade and many other features, a street carnival of several blocks in the heart of the city will be another magnet.

Under the direction of the Progressive Business Men's Club, the housing situation will be handled in a manner that will provide accommodations for everyone and eliminate all possible overcharges.

Portland's gates are to be thrown open and a royal reception for the men home from military service will be the keynote of the 1919 Victory Rose Festival.

"PASS THE CIDER"

That is what the apple grower is saying who is not busy with some arsenate of lead spray at this time. The Codling Moth is busy at egg deposition, and if fancy apples or cider apples are wanted, now is the time to decide.

Conditions are favorable for large fruit crops this year, and indications are that prices will be good. It is, therefore, important that a good quality be produced if profits are to be realized.

Use 4 lbs. of arsenate of lead paste to 100 gallons of water, or 2 lbs. of powdered arsenate to that amount of water.
