## CUT WORMS A MENACE

Numerous reports from a number of sections in the county show that cut worms are proving a serious menace to crops this season, and in some fields have made depredations that will prove disastrous to yields.

The most satisfactory method of control yet found by farmers of Washington County is the poison bran bait method which has been used a number of seasons by the union growers. This bait is made as follows—thoroughly mix 50 pounds of bran, 2 pounds of Paris green and 6 finely chopped lemons; stir to a stiff dough with low grade molasses diluted with enough water to mix well with the bran. Scatter sparingly in small jumps around bases of plants and over entire field. If bran cannot be obtained, middlings or mill run can be satisfactorily used.

J. C. Leedy has found that lemon extract can be substituted for lemons. It has also been found that the bait will be usually more effective if applied in late afternoon or early evening hours. When the weather is hot during the day the material will so dry out that other applications will have to be made.

## TEN THOUSAND DAMAGES

R. C. Cameron filed suit against George Spillman in circuit court Tuesday, alleging alienation of Mrs. Cameron's affections. The husband asks for five thousand for his own shame and humiliation, and five thousand dollars punitive damages. The complaint recites that prior to April 1, 1919, husband and wife lived together happily, and that between April 1 and May 15 of this year the defendant "wrongfully, unlawfully, willfully, wantonly and maliciously endeavored, by subtle contrivances, coaxing, promises and inducements, to entice plaintiff's wife to live apart from him and to leave and desert him, and poisoned her mind against the husband and alienated her affection from him." As a consequence, the plaintiff says the character of his wife has been ruined, blackened, and injured to the husband's humiliation and shame, distress and peace of mind.

The tax rolls do not show where the Camerons or Spillman reside. G. C. Schmidt, of Portland, is the attorney for the husband.
