NO ELK SHOOTING

"There is to be no shooting of elk in Oregon during the year 1919." Such was the declaration made by State Game Warden Carl D. Shoemaker, who has received a number of inquiries as to the date of the opening of the season for hunting elk. In order that the misunderstanding may be corrected, the Game Warden explained that the 1909 law protected elk until August 1, 1919, but this law was repealed, and protection then provided for this noble animal. "There will be no open season on elk in this state at any time unless the Legislature fixes one at some future session. We only have a few elk in the state, and an open season would kill practically all of these off," said Mr. Shoemaker.

SOME COWS

George Biersdorf, breeder of registered Jerseys, recently sold two registered cows at a fancy price, showing that it pays to handle blooded dairy stock. One bovine was sold to Mr. McLennan, of Vancouver, Wash., for \$700, and another sold to Mr. Burns, of Clarke County, for \$600. They were shipped over this week. All of which is gratifying to the stock interests of Washington County, as, outside of the first cost of getting the start, it costs no more to raise good stock than to produce scrubs.

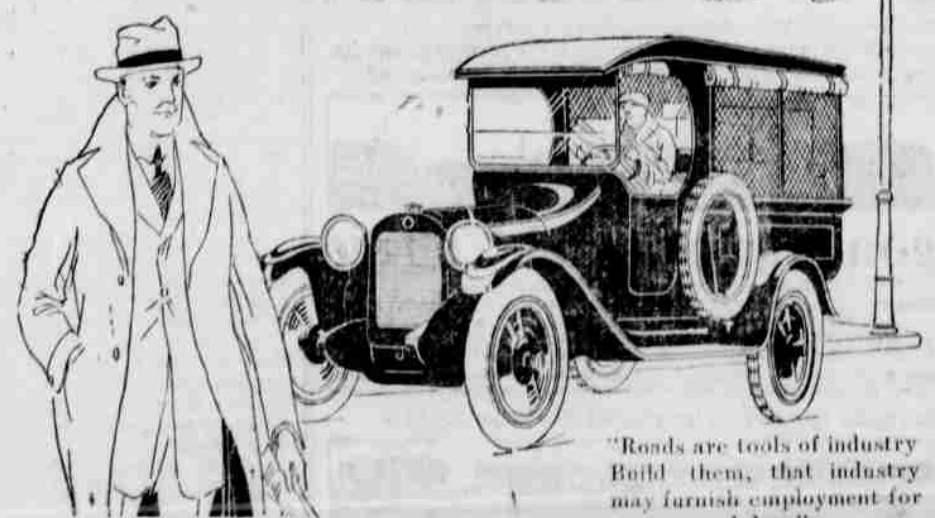
