"Nulade" Oregon eggs are bringing 54 cents a dozen when marketed by the Oregon Poultry Producers association of 250 members, representing 75,000 hens. Every egg is candled, graded and stamped, and represents as perfect an egg as can be produced. Portland retailers buck the association, as eggs have long been away under Seattle and San Francisco prices in Portland while feeds were generally a little higher.

The 4000 cows on test in Oregon slumped an average of 69.63 pounds of milk and 1.89 pounds of fat in June, because of failing pastures. This was a loss of nearly \$7000 in fat alone, and could have been prevented largely by feeding a little grain or silage. A good grain ration, says E. L. Westover, in charge of testing, is 4 parts barley, 4 oats, and 1 linseed or cottonseed meal or 2 of coconut meal.

J. B. Edgar, of Portland, engaged along architectural lines for several years, is now associated with the R. L. Tucker Lumber Co., at the old Badger site. He states that Mr. Tucker will at once put in a drafting room and give intending builders free consultation, both for the construction of homes as well as for impending changes.
