## CENSUS EXAMINATION

Some time during the week of October 27, Hillsboro will have a civil service examination for applicants to take the census of the county for the U. S. Gov't. Applicants should write prior to Oct. 15 to H. R. Crawford, Supervisor of Census, P. O. Bldg., Salem, Ore. Census takers are paid by the per capita and should make from \$4 to \$6 per day. Full particulars will be published next week, according to Fred Holanagie, deputy Postmaster.
