On Tuesday the student body had the pleasure of hearing Mr. LeVigne, a wide-awake artist, who gave the students a few selections on the piano.

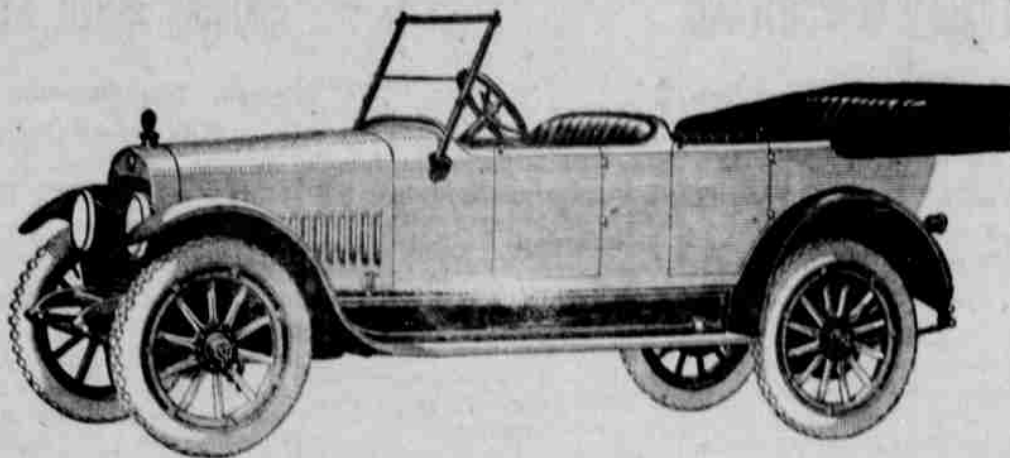
The basketball game scheduled between Beaverton and Hilli for Friday night has been called off, by Coach Seboth, due to weather conditions.

FOREST GROVE FIRE

The Odd Fellows' wooden building living apartments. The Odd Fellows lost about

ing, at Forest Grove, just a half block west of the big fire of last Summer, burned last night. The Odd Fellows, owners of the structure, occupied the upper story, and Nelson LaCourse had a grocery on the ground floor. LaCourse lived in the rear of the building, and the fire caught in about half the values. Mr. LaCourse carried no insurance. When Mr. LaCourse awakened

he found the blaze so far advanced that no effort could save the structure. This is the second fire loss the Odd Fellows have suffered within the year, their handsome new structure having been burned in the big fire of last Summer. LaCourse lost from three to four thousand. The blaze started about 3:30 this morning.
