

BANKS AND LAUREL

Prof. Pitts and Prof. Carpenter, of O. A. C., will hold dairy schools at Banks and at Laurel to take the place of the cancelled schools during the cold snap. Banks will have the two days school on January 14 and 15, and Laurel on the 16th and 17th. Prof. Pitts will talk on dairying and proper

methods, while Prof. Carpenter will talk on dairy crops. Arrangements are being perfected for a grain grading school at Soballs and at North Plains. A Home Economics School will be held at a later date at Dilley, and one at Gaston. Agent Jamison states that there

is a big call for another five days Tractor School to be held at the county seat between now and Spring. He says that the only thing at present in the way is the meeting place. The school must have cover as motors, ignition, etc., will be the course, chiefly, this year. The

school is always conducted by mechanics who are accredited, and last year's course of five days was of big benefit to those who had to do with tractors and other gasoline power machinery.

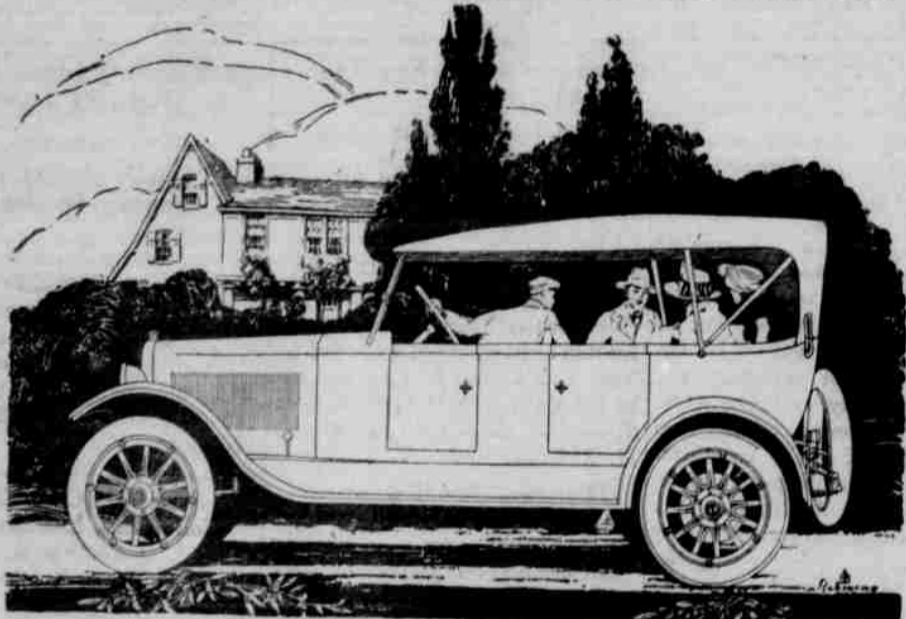
