warrants could be paid in 1920. He was supported by Thos. H. Tongue Jr., Charges that the Chairman was trying to "gag" the speakers prompted a resolution from Mr. Haines that every person should have a fair hearing. Miss Jane Allen, State Health Nurse, spoke twice in favor of the fund, and told what the county health nurse was doing. Dr. Wood's motion to strike out was opposed by Dr. Hyde and Ira E. Purdin. It was remarked that we had our cows and orchards inspected, and that the children should not be overlooked. On vote the motion of Dr. Wood was defeated by a vote of about two to one, and the budget of \$1500 was voted.

The sewer and pavement budget for the court grounds was reduced from \$1780 to \$1533, the exact amount needed.

The budget for road foreman was reduced from \$10,000 to \$8,000; for agricultural agent from \$1800 to \$1600; and the contingencies budget was raised from \$2,000 to \$5,000.

The state tax levy published at \$90,000 was raised \$4,847.93, as required by law.

The county road fund was reduced from \$70,500 to \$56,797.41; bridges, \$15,000 raised to \$20,000; road machinery fund of \$15,000 reduced to \$10,000.

The item of \$31,000, for work contracted on state highway was raised to \$70,300, so as to cover the warrants drawn and for which there are no funds. The market roads budget was adopted as originally published.

Judge Goodin explained that the warrants in question were drawn to pay for work not provided for in the last budget, and it was either do this or let the money for the state highway completed this far be diverted elsewhere for the time being.

The vote on health nurse was 138 yes to 68 no. Besides Miss Allen and Dr. Hyde, those speaking for the measure were J. W. Shute, J. E. Saunders, Jack Raynard and Miss Manche Langley.

J. B. Downing asked that action be taken to make the Garden Home thistle patch vanouse, and R. Pabols, with others, spoke in favor of the market roads budget.

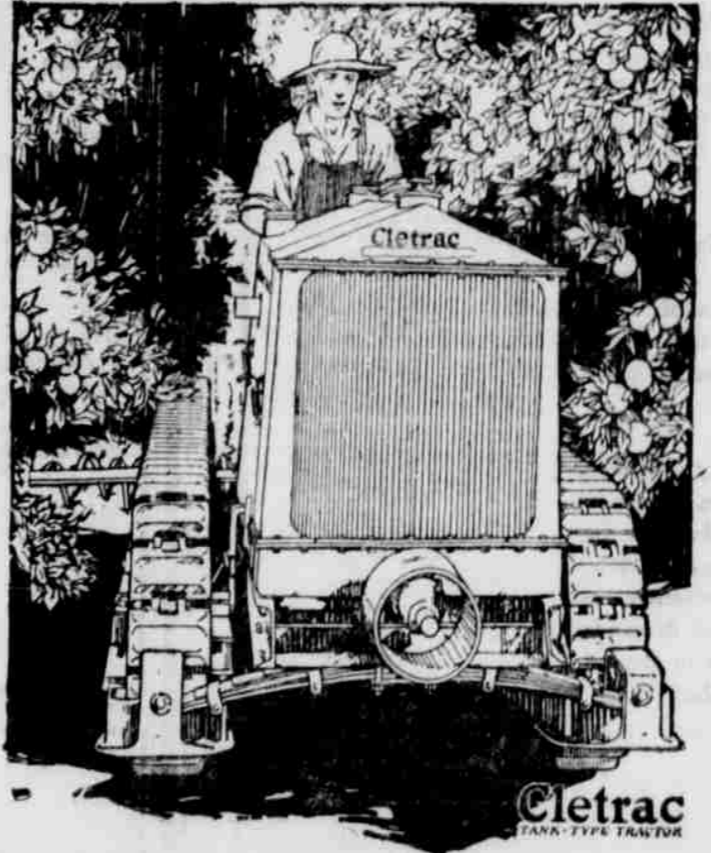
