C. Rehse's old home paper from Glen County, Cal., tells of a man raising a million and a quarter bushels of rice from 22,000 acres of tule the past year, from land that for years had been so full of alkali that it had been nothing but a goose pasture. A man named P. B. Cross plowed it, seeded it to the cereal, and irrigated it with water out of the Sacramento River, with fine results. Rice is threshed like wheat and the paper telling the story shows the machine, engine, blower and all, turning out the little white grains. Mr. Rehse says that for years the land was considered worthless. Bringing the matter into prominence was the fact that hundreds of sheep were recently poisoned so badly on the rice fields that they died. Twenty-two thousand acres of rice is said to be the largest single field in the United States.
