At Sherwood the Poultry Association is backing the boys and girls poultry projects and will have a juvenile department at their show next winter. The Bank of Sherwood is actively promoting the pig club, and Cashier R. H. Parsons will personally act as club advisor and leader. Sherwood will undoubtedly have a sewing and cooking club.

A nation-wide campaign of thrift education for peace times has been inaugurated in the schools. The primary objects of the War Savings Campaign was first—"To help win the war," and second—"Help the nation get safely back on a peace basis." The idea is that the schools shall help the parents in a line of training which is essential to the future welfare and happiness of their children, but which under present conditions they find it difficult to carry out alone.
