MOTOR LICENSES ARE HEAVY FOR 1920

Secretary of State Takes in Magnificent Sum of \$1,325,000

BIG LUMBER CARGOES GO

Million and Half Spur for Portland Firm

Portland to Pendleton highway to be ready next summer for travel. Oregon motor vehicle license fees total \$1,325,000 for 1920.

Astoria—50,000,000 feet lumber went out in ships during January.

Portland—The Northern Pacific Terminal Co. granted permit to construct spur tracks, sidings and switches for benefit of new \$1,500,000 home of Montgomery, Ward & Co. Work on the structure will start immediately.

L. J. Simpson and associates incorporate Coos Bay Logging Co. Warrenton sawmill adds 65 to crew on day and night shift.

Marshfield—A San Francisco firm will cut myrtle in Brewster valley.

Portland city council has decided it does not know how to operate the streetcar lines of that city.

Another interstate hydro-electric plant being built on paper for Oregon and Washington.

Salem—\$187,377 expended to date on soldier education aid.

Eugene—Mutual creamery acquires site for condensery.

Klamath Falls unions demand wage increase in lumber industry. Cottage Grove—New sawmill to be erected near here.

Ashland—Fruit crop here this year is largest in history.

Gearhart—New tourist hotel to be erected.

Milton—The output for Milton box factory last season was \$180,000.

Ashland—Big road contracts in this vicinity to be rushed to completion this spring.

Grazing of 1020 head of cattle and horses and 16,700 head of sheep in Cascade National forest authorized by secretary of agriculture.

Oregon food products are winning increasing prestige in outside markets.

Bend—24 miles of road built under supervision of Deschutes National forest officials at a cost of \$5772 during 1919.

St. Helens—Machine shop to be erected here.

Hood River—\$10,000 warehouse to be erected here.

Oregon's 1919 farm and orchard production crowds the half million mark, with grain the last item, over \$75,000,000. Fruit production total around \$45,000,000.

Portland—1000 acres timber adjacent to United Railways line, partly in Multnomah county and partly in Washington county, sold for \$500,000.

Klamath Falls—Klamath Valley Warehouse and Forwarding Co. adds \$10,000 worth improvements to plant.

Harrisburg—Prospects of up-to-date sawmill and factory for this city.

Astoria export shipping trade last year was \$15,000,000.

Bend—Seven million trout hatched one week at Tumalo fish hatchery.

O. A. C. CLUB TO FORM

Graduates and former students of the Oregon Agricultural College are planning to form a County O. A. C. Club, at a meeting to be held in Hillsboro, February 28, at 2:00 p. m. Letters have been sent to over seventy-five former students of the institution resident in the county, and it is felt that there are a number more whose addresses are not known.

Aside from the regular business of forming an organization, the matter of holding of meetings of a social nature will be considered, as well as other items which will be of interest to the former students.

The meeting is called by J. C. Leedy, of Scholls, a graduate of the College in the 1912 class.

FARM BUREAU

Through the organizing committee of the Farm Bureau and with the assistance of the County Agent, the farming communities are planning important work that will be undertaken in their respective sections during the coming year. Among the communities which have held meetings are Banks, Gales Creek, Sheddin, Hillside, and meeting dates have been scheduled for about fifteen other communities.

Thus far the project which has seemed most popular is Dairy Herd Improvement. Each community undertaking this work plan to upbuild their herds by getting pure bred stock and eliminating all scrub sires and will encourage the organization of boys' and girls' calf clubs.

Rodent control is also coming in for its share of consideration, and practically every one of the communities which have held meetings will name a day at which time all farmers in that section will put out poison for ground squirrels.

Other sections plan to hold poultry schools and culling demonstrations, and still other of the communities will hold drainage demonstrations, and in most of the dairy communities trials for testing out corn varieties will be made and also tests in the value of commercial fertilizers.
