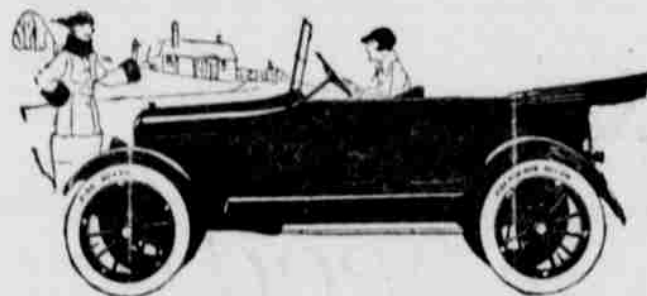

JURY ACQUITS GREGORY OF ASSAULTING GAY

Said to Have Stood Eleven for
Acquittal, One for Conviction

OUT NEARLY 24 HOURS

Celebrated Aloha Case Ends on
Sunday Afternoon, Second Trial

For the second time a jury of
twelve men failed to convict Wes-
ley J. Gregory of criminally as-
saulting John Gay, one of three
brothers at Aloha, with whom
Gregory had some trouble last
Summer.

Gregory was tried at the No-
vember term of court and the jury
failed to agree, and the same
thing happened the past week
when the case was tried the sec-
ond time. The jury went out
Saturday about five o'clock, and
at 4 p. m., Sunday, were dis-
charged by Judge Bagley, he
having ascertained that the
twelve men could not agree. It
is stated that the jury this time
stood eleven for acquittal and
one for conviction.

Gregory had some trouble with
the brothers, and on meeting
John Gay a fight ensued. He cut
Gay's arm so badly that Gay was
brought to Hillsboro for treat-
ment at the Washington County
Hospital. The case followed.

The jury at the second trial—
D. Haag, R. H. Greer, P. I.
Lilligard, Wm. Faulk, J. H. Ken-
nedy, Frank Connell, J. R. Deen,
H. Metzger, C. A. Winder-
lich, W. L. Peters, Robt. Alexan-
der and H. Clark.

As a sequel to the assault and
the trial just ended Monday
morning, John Gay brought suit
in the circuit court against Greg-
ory, asking for \$11,215 damages,
alleging that he is permanently
disabled because of some of the ten-
sions of his arm were cut, render-
ing the member practically use-
less. He asks for \$100 punitive
damages, and the balance is to
cover surgical aid and hospital
expenses.

The case of R. D. Cameron
against Geo. Spillman, suit for
\$10,000 alienation of the affec-
tions of Cora Spillman, the wife,
was settled Monday morning out
of court. The case was to have
been tried in November, but Mrs.
Cameron had given birth to a
child in October, and was in no
condition to appear in court. The
case was continued and was to
have been tried this week. As
the case was settled it was or-
dered stricken from the docket.
