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THE TWO MILL TAX

The objection has been raised to the two mill state tax for elementary education that school taxes are already heavy and have been increasing rapidly.

The following is the millage for County School and Library fund the past six years:

1914	3.18 mills
1915	3.22 mills
1916	3.12 mills
Average for the 3 years is 3.175 mills.	
1917	3.086 mills
1918	3.188 mills
1919	3.235 mills
Average for the 3 years is 3.169 mills.	

The average millage for the past three years shows an actual decrease over the average three years previous.

The amount paid out by the school clerks for all expenses including teachers' salaries, janitors, fuel, insurance, interest and principal of bonds, outstanding warrants and every other item during the years 1917-1918 and 1919 averaged \$193,000 per year. The average of the same expenditures for the five years preceding 1917 was \$183,640 per year. This shows an increase during these three years of high prices of less than 6 per cent in the total cost of running the schools over the average of the 5 years preceding.

The above is an exhibit of the strange fact that taxes for schools in Washington County have not been increasing to any appreciable extent.

More money must be raised for schools and the only question is, "Shall it all be raised by the unjust method of district special tax varying in different districts from nothing to 20 mills or shall part of it be raised by a general two mill tax on all the property in the state?"

43 per cent of all the money used for schools last year was raised by special district taxes and one-fourth of the taxable property was practically exempt. Twelve districts in Washington County having an aggregate valuation of \$2,550,500 had no special school tax this year, and ten more districts with an aggregate valuation of \$2,761,032 levied less than 1 mill.

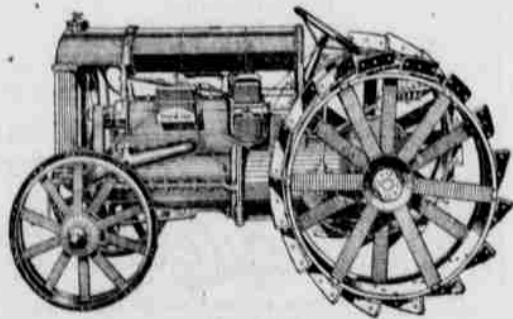
