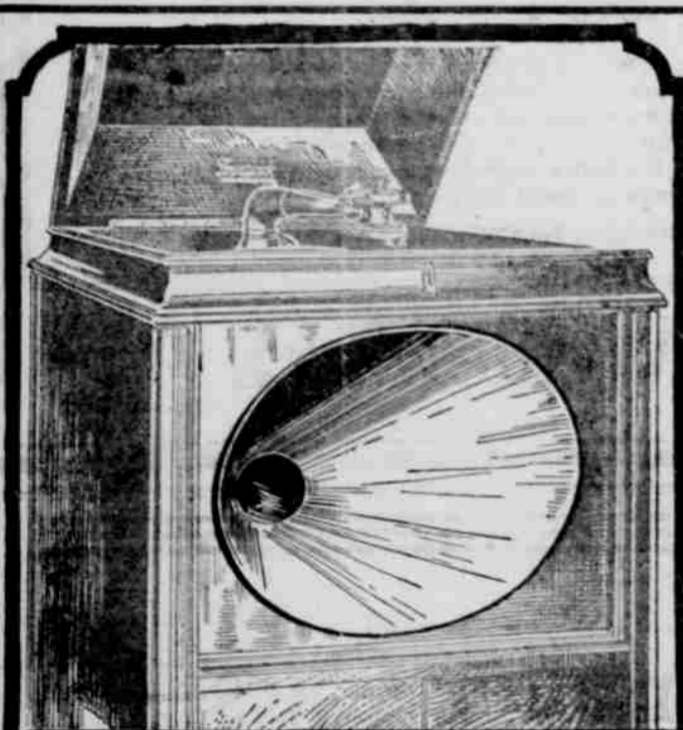

The government has no alternative but to pay big wages to shipyard workers, ammunition workers and other war activity laborers during the war period. This forced the employing people all over the country to pay larger wages or go laborless. War created the condition. Our boys on land and sea enlisted to the government cause, worked for victory—and they should be paid accordingly. They are entitled to more than what they have received. The slacker at home profited by the condition, and labor everywhere profited by the same token. Give the boys a raise, and pay it to them in a lump sum—and do it right away, is the real essence of the situation that should be taken by a government that has any claim to responsiveness. The pending proposition of a dollar and a half a day for time served in addition to the meagre pay given the boys is the least that the government can, or should do. If every newspaper in the country would come out and support it the measure would be passed. A grateful Congress should do more, and do it quickly.

**RURAL CARRIERS EXAMS FOR FOUR OFFICES**

Will be Held at Forest Grove on May Eighth

**BIGGEST TO BE POSTED**

Want Writers on Gaston, Hillsboro, Laurel and Sherwood

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced an examination for the County of Washington, Ore., to be held at Forest Grove, Hillsboro, Portland, Ore., on May 8, 1920, to fill the position of rural carrier at Gaston, Hillsboro, Laurel Sherwood, Ore., and vacancies that may later occur on rural routes from other post offices in the above-mentioned county. The examination will be open only to citizens who are actually domiciled in the territory of a post office in the county and who meet the other requirements set forth in Form No. 1977. Both men and women, if qualified, may enter this examination, but appointing officers have the legal right to specify the sex desired in requesting certification of eligibles. Women will not be considered for rural carrier appointment unless they are the widows of U. S. soldiers, sailors, or marines, or the wives of U. S. soldiers, sailors, or marines who are physically disqualified for duty. Form No. 1977 and application blanks may be obtained from the offices mentioned above or from the United States Civil Service Commission at Washington, D. C. Applications should be forwarded to the Commission at Washington at the earliest practicable date.

**SCHOOL NEWS**

Leading business and neighborhood organizations of Washington County go on record as favoring the two mill tax for elementary education.

At the regular meeting of the Hillsboro Commercial Club Tuesday evening, March 30, the proposed two mill tax for elementary education was discussed at some length. At the close of the discussion, a resolution favoring support of this measure was unanimously passed.

Co. Supt. Frost addressed the Sherwood Business Men's Association at their regular luncheon, March 24, on the subjects of the two mill tax and Union High School. At their following meeting, March 31, a resolution was passed unanimously endorsing the two mill tax. Several of the neighboring districts have become actively interested in the union high school and success of the enterprise seems assured.

The Witch Hazel school held a program and basket social March 27. Co. Supt. Frost was present and explained the need and working of the two mill tax. A resolution of the Parent-Teachers' Association endorsing the measure was introduced and passed unanimously.

Gale Grange, at their regular meeting at Forest Grove, April 3, passed a resolution unanimously endorsing the bill for a two mill tax for elementary education.

A copy of this bill with explanations has been sent to all the 110 school boards. Out of 60 replies so far received, only two have been opposed to the bill.

**MRS. FRITZ GINDHART**

Mrs. Fritz Gindhart died at the family home near Buxton, March 29, 1920, survived by the husband and a son, aged three days. Her maiden name was Elsie Laura Paetsch, and she was born near Buxton, on the father's homestead, July 22, 1896. The family moved from Buxton to Shady Brook later on, and on July 1, 1919, she was married to Mr. Gindhart, at Lebanon, Oregon. After marriage she and her husband lived near Buxton until death separated them. She was highly respected by all who knew her, being a lover of home life, a good neighbor, and ever ready to share the responsibilities of life both at home and in the community. She was a life long member of the Lutheran Church. The funeral took place from the home of Martin Gindhart, and notwithstanding the inclement weather, was largely attended.

Undertaker H. W. Prickett conducted the funeral. Besides the husband and son she is survived by a father and mother, a brother, and two sisters.

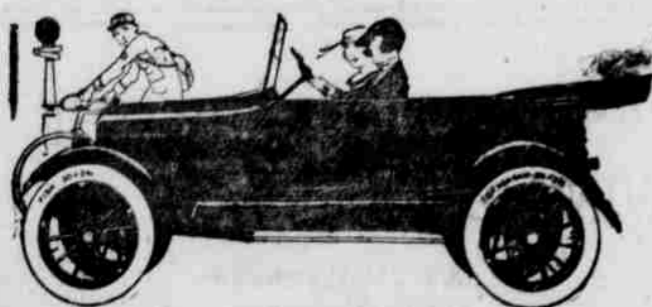
